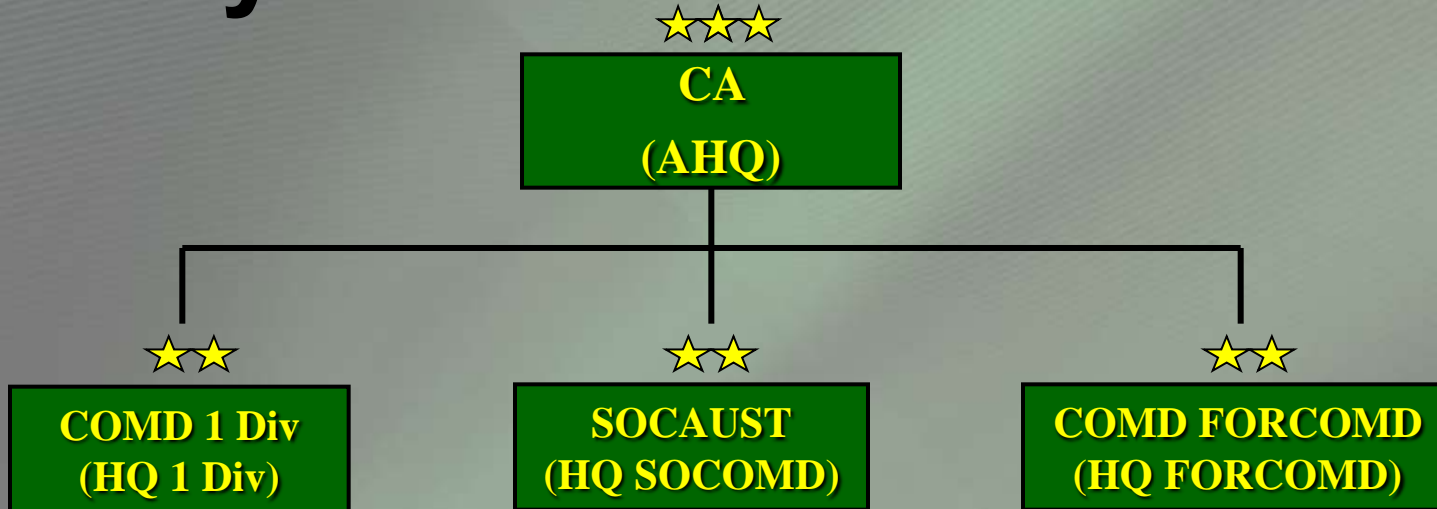

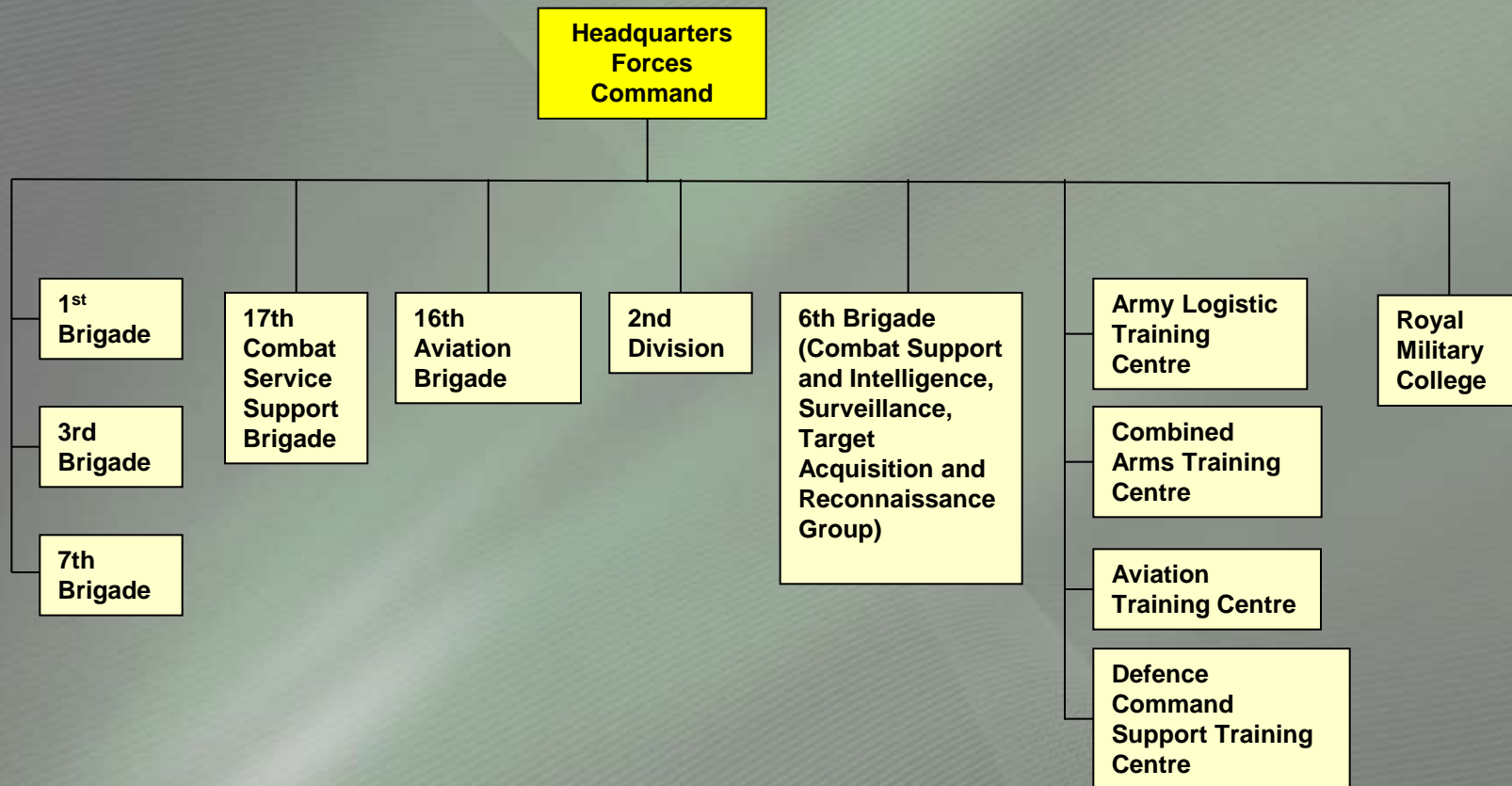
Army Command Structure



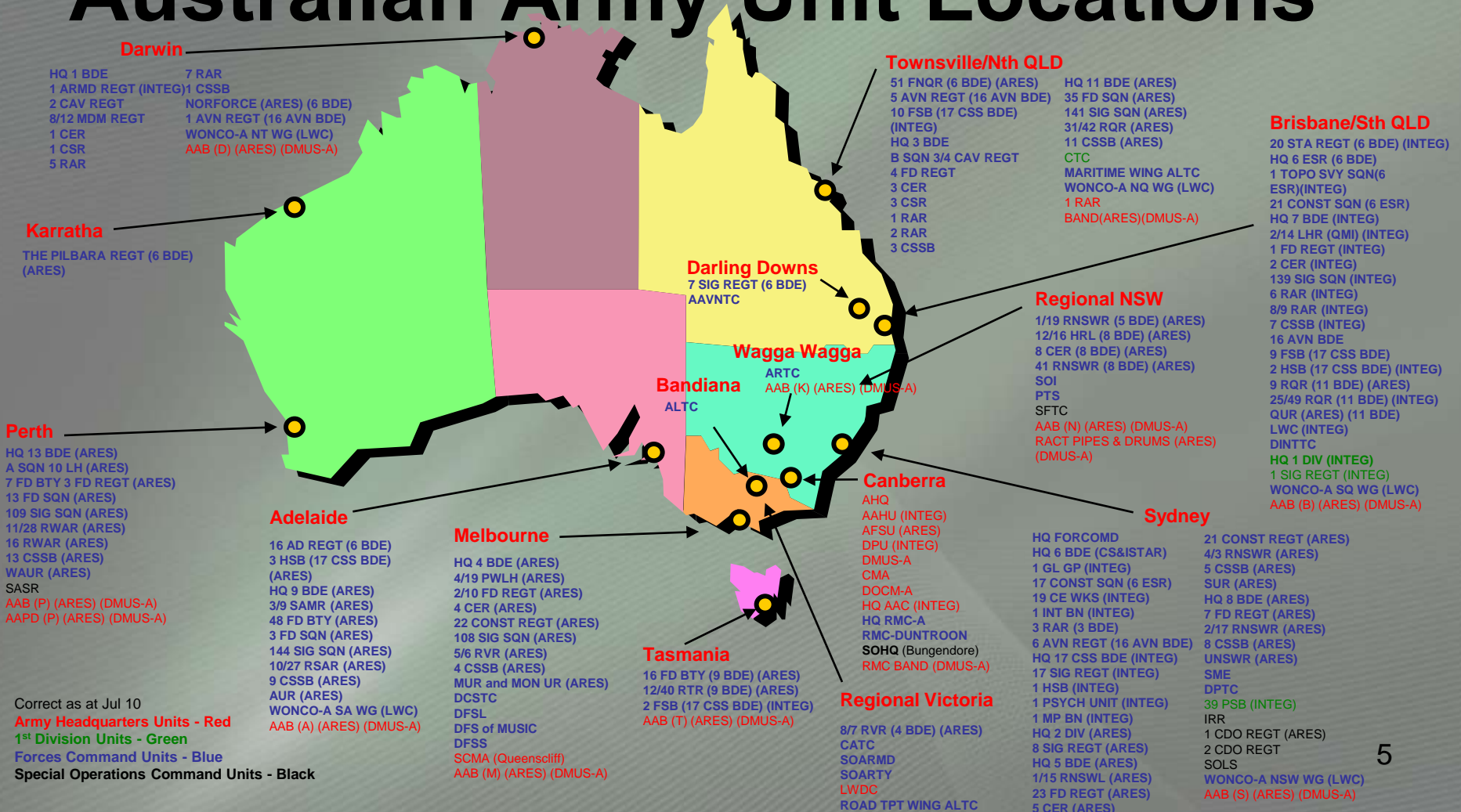
Command and Control

- FORCOMD raised 1 July 2009
 - Amalgamation of Training and Land Commands
 - Full time and Active Reserve : 37,344 pers
 - 86.3% of Army's full time commitment
 - 88.3% of Army's Active Reserve
 - Spread over 48 Barracks and 97 Depots

FORCOMD Mission

- FORCOMD is to generate Army's foundation warfighting capability IOT ensure individuals and FE are successful in adaptive campaigning.



- Centre of Gravity
 - The FORCOMD centre of gravity is assessed as the ability to force generate to required standard. FORCOMD strength is based upon the effective force generation of FE for operations who have the right foundation warfighting skills.

Foundation Warfighting

- Comprises individual and collective ***skills, knowledge and attitudes*** fundamental to operational capability & readiness to enable FE to successfully conduct the **full spectrum of sustained operations** required for adaptive campaigning

Army Training Continuum – Components

- Individual Training
 - Foundation Warfighting training at trg establishments & within land fmns
- Collective Training
 - Collective Foundation Warfighting Trg
 - Pre-Deployment Trg (PDT):
 - Mission Specific Training
 - Mission Rehearsal Exercise
- Organisational Learning
 - Lessons/knowledge incorporated
 - Adaptive knowledge delivery systems:
 - Directed/managed learning
 - Initiative-based

Current Commercial Arrangements

- 30 + Arrangements
- Contracts / Standing Offers / MOA
- Flexible Training and Training support
 - On base with GFF/GFE to specified Learning Outcomes from Training Management Plans; or
 - Off site against national competencies; or
 - Research and analysis e.g.: Training Needs Analysis; or
 - Short and long term arrangements
- Order Book value of \$150M
